# Holy Family Catholic School

## MISSION STATEMENT

With Jesus, Mary and Joseph as our models,  
Holy Family Catholic School prepares students  
for roles in the parish, home, civic and global communities  
by educating them in their Catholic faith and in those skills  
necessary to foster academic excellence.

**Holy Family Catholic School** opened its doors in 1956 with 75 eager students housed in two portable classroom buildings. Today approximately 215 students from kindergarten through eighth grade populate the two story building erected in 1961 and enlarged in 1977.

The school provides a warm, caring, safe environment where students are encouraged to develop a positive self-image and an acceptance of others as they begin to live out the Gospel message.

There is a strong academic curriculum that includes Spanish, computer skills, music, art, and physical education. Students have opportunities for involvement in music/mime ministry, sign language, violin, chess and after school sports.

Holy Family Catholic School is a member of the National Catholic Educational Association and is accredited by the Florida Catholic Conference. Our teachers are certified by the Department of Education of the State of Florida.

The school's extended day program provides students with the opportunity for supervised study and play activities from dismissal to 6 PM on days that school is in session.

**Holy Family Early Childhood Center** is a pre-school committed to provide an accepting, secure, Christ-filled environment in which children are nurtured and can learn and grow. It accepts students from two to four years old and participates in the Florida VPK program.

It is regulated by the Pinellas County Licensing Board and continues to be in full compliance with the regulations of that board. As part of Holy Family Catholic School, the Center is also accredited by the Florida Catholic Conference.



## **PARISH COUNCILS**

### **Pastoral Council**

- The Pastoral Council is a representative body composed of twelve parishioners, age 16 or older. Its primary role is to:
  - Serve as an advisory group to the pastor.
  - Plan and prioritize the goals and objectives for the parish.
  - Seek the input of parishioners in the formation of these goals and objectives.
  - Promote relationship building through communication within the parish and with the larger Church communities.
  - Serve as liaison with the parish Finance Council, Stewardship Council, Faith Formation Advisory Council, and the School Advisory Council.

### **Finance Council**

- The Finance Council consists of three to six members, and meets nine times a year to review parish finances, and provide the pastor with fiscal advice.

### **Stewardship Council**

- The Stewardship Council has the general responsibility for stewardship awareness and support the efforts ensuring needs are met. The council is dedicated to making parishioners aware of the concept of stewardship as a way of life and the need to share generously their God-given gifts of time, talent and treasure with Holy Family Catholic Parish, Holy Family Catholic School, and the parish community at large.
- This Council is also responsible for the Time and Talent Ministry Fair and for preparation of this Ministry Guide. Membership consists of 7 to 8 registered parishioners.

## **FAITH FORMATION**

### **Sacramental Preparation**

- The Director of Faith Formation works with Holy Family Catholic School and with parish groups to ensure that all who are seeking the sacraments have been adequately prepared. These include:
  - Infant Baptism
  - First Holy Communion
  - Confirmation
  - Marriage

### **Faith Formation Advisory Commission**

- The function and responsibility of this ministry is to partner with the Pastor and the Director of Faith Formation in setting the direction of Faith Formation within the parish. The commission determines the needs of parishioners in all age groups and supports the implementation of programs that bring about their spiritual growth.

### **Religious Education for Children & Teens**

- “Sunday School” is available to children grades K through 8. The mission of the process is to deepen the students’ relationship with God by education, prayer and service. Our efforts are directed to increasing their knowledge of the faith and the Parish, and to draw them into the life of the parish community.

### **Generations of Faith**

- Generations of Faith offers parents, children and all parishioners, the opportunity to study and grow in their faith in developmentally appropriate ways.

### **Small Faith Communities**

- Small faith communities meet to share prayer, read and break open the scriptures, and reflect on the impact of the scriptures on their lives. Groups meet for two six-week sessions each year. Small faith communities meet in the homes of the members, often on a rotating basis. Groups are lead by volunteers under the guidance of the Director of Faith Formation.

### **Scripture Study**

- Men's Bible Study
  - This ministry was formed to assemble a group of men who want to study the Bible with a focus toward Catholic commentary. A typical study entails 8 – 11 weeks of lessons on a specific gospel or other focused section of the Bible.
- Women's Bible Study
  - This group meets on Monday mornings to study selected segments of the Bible. Book presentations will be included.

### **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)**

- The function of the RCIA team is to assist the Pastor and the Director of Faith Formation in the process of inquiry and preparation for initiation into the Catholic faith.

### **Catholic Adult Formation & Education (CAFÉ)**

- The function of this team is to advise the Director of Faith Formation and assist in planning the Adult Faith Formation programs.

### **Vacation Bible School**

- Each summer, Holy Family Parish offers a Catholic program for Vacation Bible School for children entering Kindergarten through Grade 6.

### **Youth Ministry**

- The Holy Family Youth Ministry offers young people opportunities for faith formation in a social setting. Catholic values are emphasized and the group is involved in numerous service projects throughout the year.

## LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

### **Liturgy Commission**

- The Liturgy Commission is responsible for formation, education, and evaluation concerning liturgical issues in Holy Family Parish. This commission provides the pastor and the parish Liturgy Planning Committee with suggestions for improving the liturgical life of the parish and will assist the pastor in implementing them.

### **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion**

- Fully initiated members of the parish are commissioned to assist the priest at Mass with distribution of Holy Communion. Training is required.
- Ministers may elect to take Holy Communion to the sick and homebound, to hospitals, nursing homes and assisted living facilities. Diocesan Safe Environment Training is required for those who minister in this capacity.

### **Readers**

- Members of the parish are commissioned to assist at Mass by proclaiming the Word of God. A willingness to learn about the Bible, the Lectionary, and possession of the skills necessary for public proclamation are essential. Training is required.

### **Altar Servers**

- All boys and girls 10 years old and up are encouraged to participate as an altar server. Servers should be mature enough to understand their responsibilities and to carry them out well. They should have already received Holy Communion for the first time.

- Their formation and training will include instruction on the Mass and its parts and their meaning, the various objects used in the liturgy (their names and use), and the various functions of the server during the Mass and other liturgical celebrations.

## **Music Ministry**

- **Adult Choir**
  - Sings at the 11 a.m. Mass from mid-September through the Feast of Pentecost. They also sing for Christmas, Holy Week, and other major festival occasions in the life of the parish. The Choir maintains an extensive repertoire of modern and traditional choral music to complement our liturgies. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m. The ability to read music, though helpful, is not required.
- **Children's Choir**
  - Open to all children in the parish who are registered either in Holy Family School or Religious Education programs, grades 3 through 8. The Children's Choir sings once a month during the school year, usually at the 5:00 Saturday afternoon or 9:00 Sunday morning Mass; for the parish Festival of Lessons & Carols; for the Christmas Eve Vigil Mass; First Communion, and other events in the life of the parish.
  - The children have the option of attending an afternoon rehearsal on Mondays (3:00 – 3:45) or an evening rehearsal on Thursdays (7:00 – 7:45.) *They only need to attend one rehearsal or the other, not both.* The week before they sing a Family Mass, both sections of the Choir are combined at the 7 pm rehearsal on Thursday evening so that they can

practice with each other and the accompanist. The choir is directed by Robert Todd.

▪ **Folk Choir**

- Our Folk Group sings year-round at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. It is open to singers age 14 and older. They sing a mixture of contemporary and traditional music using a variety of musical instruments. Rehearsal is weekly, an hour prior to Mass and monthly for an hour after Mass on Sunday.

▪ **Cantors**

- Holy Family is fortunate to have dedicated singers who are willing to spend time in individual preparation as leaders of singing for our public worship. Because of the leadership involved in this ministry, an audition and the ability to read music are required. Cantors are provided with music and materials in advance and are afforded the opportunity to rehearse with the Music Director. If you would be interested in assisting the parish by serving as a Cantor (*especially for the 7:30 A.M. Mass on Sundays!*) please contact Robert Todd.

▪ **Instrumental Ensemble**

**Ministers of Hospitality**

▪ **Greeters**

- Men, women, and children are invited to be a welcoming presence at the entrances of the church. They warmly greet each person who enters and distribute the service sheet for Masses.

- **Ushers**

- Men, women, and young adults welcome everyone as they arrive for Mass; coordinate the collections, assist with the Communion procession, give the parish bulletin to people after Mass, and tidy up the pews in preparation for the next liturgy.

- **Bus Drivers / Transportation**

- Our drivers pick up parishioners who otherwise could not get to church and return them to their homes after Mass on weekends and holy days.

- **Liturgical Environment Committee**

- Members of this committee assist the church sacristan with the seasonal liturgical decoration of our worship space as well as routine preparations of the worship space for all liturgies.

## **SOCIAL OUTREACH/PASTORAL CARE**

The office of Pastoral Care/Outreach is the office under which the entire social and outreach programs of Holy Family Catholic Parish function. Below are ministries, programs and organizations that fall under this office:

- **Aged to Perfection**

- The function of this group is to provide a social opportunity for seniors to gather and enjoy each other's company while having some entertainment, learning of services that are available to them from the various agencies that send representatives to speak, and learning from other speakers who bring their work knowledge, travel experiences, or any other experiences that may be of interest to the group.

### **F.A.S.T. (Faith and Action for Strength Together)**

- F.A.S.T. is an organization of 30 faith-based congregations in Pinellas County representing 50,000 people. F.A.S.T. works to bring about change in critical community problems. It does not provide services to treat the problems but rather finds and works toward solutions to the problems so systemic changes occur. The board members and the Justice Ministry Network Team Leaders carry on the work of this ministry within Holy Family Parish.

### **Grief Support**

- This ministry consists of a three-pronged approach that reaches out to our parishioners who have lost a loved one.
  - The **Funeral Liaison Team** works with the grieving family to plan a liturgical service that is meaningful to them. If needed, the team will also assist with the funeral home arrangements as well as the planning of a reception following the liturgy or interment.
  - The **Bereavement Support Team** provides support in a group setting to those who are working through the most difficult time in the process of grieving.
  - **Hope Anew** provides an outlet in a group setting to those working through the loss of a loved one.

### **St. Vincent de Paul Society**

- The St. Vincent de Paul Society helps those less fortunate with basic needs using pastoral charity with dignity. It also aims to bring about spiritual formation and an increase of personal holiness in its members by acting and relating to their clients.

### **Project Hunger**

- The function of this ministry is to collect the food, which is donated by parishioners on the third weekend of each month. The St. Vincent de Paul Society distributes this food to the needy within the Holy Family Catholic Parish boundaries.

### **Meals on Wheels**

- The function of this ministry is to pick up and deliver meals within our parish boundaries to those who are unable to prepare their own. Meals are delivered on four routes each week.

### **Samaritans**

- The function of this ministry is to visit the homebound and nursing home residents within the Holy Family Catholic Parish community. The Samaritans offer respite from loneliness and serve as a connection to the parish.

### **Holiday Baskets**

- The function of this group is to reach out to the parishioners previously helped by the St. Vincent de Paul Ministry, and also to provide an opportunity to our parishioners to share food and gifts to the needy of our parish, at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

### **Thanksgiving Dinner**

- The function of this group is to provide a Thanksgiving meal for our parishioners who may be alone for the holidays. This event is usually held on the Sunday afternoon prior to Thanksgiving Day and is served in Diffley Hall. Much of the food and supplies are donated by other parish ministries and organizations. Dinners are delivered to the homebound that are unable to attend.

### **S.H.A.R.E.**

- S.H.A.R.E. is a non-profit organization that uses food to promote community participation. The host site at Holy Family maintains liaison between the local parish and community to the larger organization.

## **SPIRITUAL LIFE**

### **Rosary Makers**

- The function of this group is to make rosaries that are sent to the foreign missions and distributed to other groups as requested.

### **Legion of Mary**

- This is a worldwide association of Catholic men and women, which is sanctioned by the Church. The object of the Legion of Mary is to bring people to Jesus through Mary by the prayers and good works of its members.

### **Vocation Awareness**

- The function of this ministry is to pray for and encourage vocations.

### **Respect Life**

- This ministry is a group of men and women of Holy Family Parish who believe in the sanctity of life from the womb to the grave. It supports pro-life legislation by encouraging parishioners to make telephone calls and/or write letters to our legislators regarding pro-life and social justice issues. It also sponsors collection drives during the year to support local organizations that help women in crisis pregnancies with personal and baby items.

### **Prayer Line**

- The function and responsibility of this group is to pray for ongoing requests by Mass attendance, rosary, penitential sacrifice and/or other types of prayer and worship to our Heavenly Father.

## **PARISH LIFE**

### **New Member Welcome Committee**

- The function of this committee is to provide an opportunity for new parishioners to register in the parish and to receive orientation to the parish and its ministries and organizations.

### **Council of Catholic Women (CCW)**

- The function of the Holy Family Council of Catholic Women is:
  - Promote the spiritual welfare of the women of Holy Family Parish.
  - Sponsor and promote social activities to build parish community.
  - Work and cooperate with the Pastor to promote the welfare of the parish and its ministries.
  - Support the Parish Vision Statement.

### **Knights of Columbus**

- This is a fraternal organization of Catholic men. The function of this organization is:
  - To promote charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism
  - To be involved in other ministries of Holy Family Catholic Parish.
  - Support seminarians.
  - Support other civic and community causes.

### **Gift Shop**

- It is the function of the Gift Shop to make available religious and inspirational items to our parish community. It offers an opportunity for the manager and volunteers to learn more about our faith as they serve others.

### **Boy Scouts**

- It is the function of the Boy Scouts of America to prepare young men to make ethical choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Boy Scout Oath and Law.

### **Girl Scouts**

- It is the function of the Girl Scouts of America to prepare young women to make ethical choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Girl Scout Oath and Law.



*In addition to the ministries and organizations listed above, the following also offer opportunities to volunteer your time, talent or treasure for the Parish and School:*

### **Parish Office Staff Assistance**

- Volunteer help is frequently needed for many of the clerical tasks that are essential to supporting the parish and its organizations. Tasks might include filing, copying, keyboarding, stuffing bulletins, and answering phones.

## **Holy Family School**

- Opportunities for volunteer service abound at Holy Family Catholic School and Holy Family Early Childhood Center. Interested parishioners are invited to make a difference by volunteering as tutors, teacher assistants, library aides, or lunchroom aides. (All volunteers who work with children must complete a Safe-Environment training course and pass a level two screening.)

### **The Annual Auction**

- This is the school's principal fund raising event and provides many different opportunities for volunteer service.

### **The Adopt-A-Class Program**

- This program offers parishioners the opportunity to sponsor a particular classroom or school program, e.g. Computer Skills, Library, Science, Physical Education, Art or Music, as well as our Guidance Program.

### **Golf Tournament**

- Each May a Golf Tournament is held to raise funds for school programs. Volunteers are needed to plan, organize and participate in the Tournament.

### **School Advisory Commission**

- The function of this ministry is to provide recommendations and guidelines to assist the Pastor and School Administrator to operate a successful Catholic education program.

### **Home and School Association**

- The Home and School Association is consultative in nature and function. Its members assist the school and Administrator in the areas of parent education, development for the school and communication between the parents and teachers.
